

Canadian Electrical Code (CEC) Review Course



The course ELEA 1837 - Canadian Electrical Code (CEC) Review is a self-study course (not supported by an instructor).

This course may assist construction and industrial electrician apprentices and trade qualifiers who struggle with the use of the Canadian Electrical Code, part 1 (CEC). Internationally-trained electricians may also be unfamiliar with Code requirements. This course was designed to introduce these individuals to the CEC, in preparation for the Red Seal certification examination.

**NOTE**

This course is **not intended** for Red Seal certified individuals, nor is it intended to update certified individuals about changes to the CEC.

What the Course Includes


1. How to use, interpret and navigate the various sections of the Canadian Electrical Code, Part 1;
2. How to effectively interpret the rules; and
3. Exercises to illustrate and practice interpreting and navigating techniques.

Enrolment is continuous. There is a course-ending exam of 50 multiple-choice questions with a pass mark of 70%. The course is available at the subsidized training rate, subject to revision.

Eligible Clients

Clients eligible to take this course include:

1. Fourth or final-year apprentices
2. Trade qualifiers
3. Internationally-trained electricians
4. Certified construction or industrial electricians who wish to write their Red Seal exam
5. Individuals whose work may benefit from having knowledge of the CEC (such as inspectors, engineers, technologists, etc.)

**NOTE**

It is recommended that internationally-trained clients also take the course ELEA-1839, Canadian Electrical Practices.
